VISITING DAYS & TIME

DAY	VISITING HOURS
Mon / Wed / Sat	9:30 a.m.–12:00 p.m. 1:00 p.m.–3:00 p.m.
Visit frequency	Convicted: 2 monthly Remandee: 2 weekly

VISITOR REQUIREMENTS

General visitors

Approved visitors must present identification. All visits are supervised by an officer.

Food days

Food days are the first and third Wednesdays.

Visit arrangements

In-person visits use child-friendly spaces, last 15 minutes and are non-contact.

Legal visitors

Attorneys, NGOs, CBOs and others apply via the Attorneys and Others form, with valid professional or government ID. Max three persons; declare all items; tape recorders need written approval.

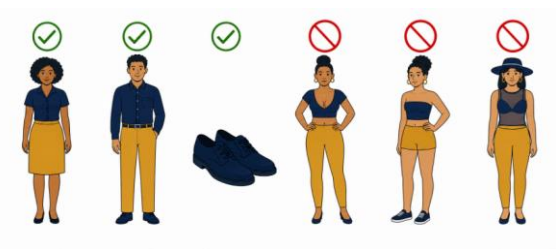
Safety and searches

Child safeguarding, court placement, supervised movement, respectful searches, separation and Nexus-controlled access support safety.

Dress code and orderly conduct

No sleeveless or off-shoulder tops, shorts, leggings, crop tops, or tight clothing.

Dress Code



Neat, modest attire is required; visitors who are not appropriately dressed will be refused entry.

Prohibited Articles



Items strictly prohibited on the premises:

- Weapons and ammunition
- Drugs, alcohol and other intoxicants
- Tobacco products
- Electronic communication devices
- Recording devices
- Unauthorized food (oats, cup noodles, etc.)
- Unauthorized medications
- Cash and valuables
- Parcels

Possession or introduction of prohibited articles will result in Police action and possible charges.

Institutional Structure

Civilian leadership and uniform hierarchy

Reception & Orientation

- Court commitment documents verified
- Identity confirmed; search and shower completed
- Registration, rights and screening completed
- Property secured; family and case contacts started
- Clothing, toiletries and bedding issued
- Child-friendly orientation covers routines, visits, and visits, and complaints

MEDICAL CENTRE

Health Care Services

- Screening plus routine and emergency care
- Mental-health, trauma and self-harm prevention support
- Dietitian, psychological, psychiatric, gynaecological and dental referrals
- Medication, health education, consent, records and treatment planning

Daily Routine

- **Education** — core subjects, literacy, information technology and study
- **Care and safety** — supervised movement, safeguarding and hygiene
- **Well-being** — health care, counselling, recreation recreation and spiritual care
- **Family and legal access** — visits, calls, court preparation and attorneys

Nutrition & Food Services

Three nutritious meals, safe water and age-appropriate portions support approved dietary needs.

DCS NEXUS: SECURE RECORDS

Security & Public Safety

- Child safeguarding and lawful court placement
- Safe accommodation, supervised movement and Nexus access
- Respectful searches, contraband prevention and separation
- Safe access to court, family, school and health care

Discipline & Grievance

Rules are explained clearly and responses are fair, proportionate, recorded and positive. Children may complain to the Board of Visitors; child-rights concerns go to the Children’s Advocate or related agencies.

Remand, Leave & Release

- Remand:** May end through bail or court-ordered ordered release.
- Leave:** Approved home leave or licence may apply.
- Release:** Release planning supports return to family and community.

REHABILITATION IN ACTION

Rehabilitation & Reintegration

Rehabilitation pathways support safer reintegration: reintegration:

- Core subjects, IT, sewing, cosmetology and life skills
- Chaplaincy counselling, conflict resolution, mentoring and spiritual care
- Home leave, education continuity, documents and aftercare
- Individualised pathways build confidence and practical skills



Rehabilitation does not end with release.

Post-Care Support

- Rehabilitation Grant for start-up or study
- Supervision by Probation Aftercare Officers

Accommodation Standards

Housing reflects legal status, age, health, and safety safety needs. Clean accommodation, bedding, water, water, sanitation, and privacy are maintained in in accordance with international standards.
